Parity democracy, or paritocracy, is a democracy where women and men become true partners in citizenship and leadership, sharing equal responsibilities in government and administration, parliament and political parties, the judiciary and the media, and over public revenue and expenditure. Parity democracy is an end in itself, to bring to bear on public affairs the intelligence and creativity, the courage and integrity, the kindness and compassion, and the enthusiasm and industry of both halves of humankind. It is also a means to a world where every girl, as well as every boy, from Afghanistan to ex-Zaire, receives adequate nutrition, secondary education, and the expectation of gainful employment and an independent income; and to a world where women and girls enjoy freedom from violence and from the fear of violence.

Raymond Lloyd is a British citizen, born in Torquay on 28 November 1934. He holds United Kingdom passport 306813938, issued by the Office of the Identity & Passport Service (IPS) in London on 17 January 2008 and valid till 17 January 2018. He is resident at

Since 1980 Raymond Lloyd has written extensively on development and democracy, human rights and women's advancement, food and agriculture, peace and the environment, architecture and design, travel and information technology. From 1980 to 1996 he was correspondent of the Oxford-based, 1973-founded, *New Internationalist* (ISSN 03050-9529), the largest circulation monthly on world development.

From 1988 to 2000, he was also a correspondent of *Freedom Review*, the bimonthly journal of Freedom House, 120 Wall Street, New York NY 10005. Freedom House was established in 1941 in New York to strengthen democratic institutions. *Freedom Review* (ISSN 1054-3090) is no longer published, but the yearbook *Freedom in the World* remains the leading international compendium on political rights and civil liberties. Raymond Lloyd's work has also been published independently on the web, from 2000 to 2002 by the Washington-based webzine at www.the-idler.com

Since the 1980s Raymond Lloyd has been accredited to many national and international meetings, including the World Women's Conferences in Copenhagen, Nairobi and Beijing, over fifty European Councils, twelve G7/8 summits, six Nato summits, all World Bank/IMF Annual Meetings since 1980, and most European Bank meetings since 1990; to Commonwealth, Francophone and Iberoamerican summits, five Paralympic Games, and to many meetings of the UN and its specialized agencies.
